### **III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Recreation & Parks Commission Special Meeting Minutes – October 4, 2016

Commissioner Trujillo motioned for approval of the minutes, Commissioner DeVost seconded the

motion; all were in favor of approval. The minutes of the October 4, 2016 Recreation & Parks Commission Meeting, were approved as mailed.

After approval of the meeting minutes, Commissioner Britt asked if there were any discussion items from the public;

#### **IV. DISCUSSION ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC**

A question asked from the audience, “When will we start working on the snack bars?” Commissioner Britt responded stating that when Director Perry Brents returns to the chambers, it can be discussed then.

#### **V. INFORMATION/STATUS REPORTS**

##### **A. Program Updates**

##### **1. Presentation: Grace Vargas Senior Center- Terre Ermitano**

Terre began her presentation by greeting the Commissioners and introducing herself as Recreation Programmer overseeing the Grace Vargas Senior Center, formally known as the Rialto Senior Center.

Terre acknowledged her supporting staff personnel, shared general contact information and proceeded with their mission which is to improve the lives of Senior participants by providing activities, programs and resources to meet the need of Seniors in Rialto. Ms. Ermitano continued listing exercise activities, entertainment activities and other leisure classes catered to Rialto citizens ages 55 and up. A list of services were provided including the mobile office of Congress Woman Norma Torres, the Department of Aging and Adult Services, a hair salon and a nutrition program which provides hot lunches for \$3.00. In addition, Terre listed exclusive annual social events such as The Health and Wellness Expo, Dances with live music, and more. In closing, Ms. Ermitano briefly mentioned the available rooms and halls for rent to the public for special gatherings followed by opening for questions of the Commission.

A question from the public was “is alcohol is allowed during public rentals?” Terre replied yes but, there are additional fees and insurances that are applied.

Commissioner Britt said that Terre is doing a tremendous job with staff and programming at the facility and gave a round of applause for her hard work.

##### **B. Project Updates**

##### **1. Capital Improvement Projects – Public Works**

Assistant Engineer Moises Peralta presented the oral report on behalf of the Public Works

department for Capital Improvement Projects as follows;

**a. Johnson Center**

**1. Fencing Project**

The fencing project is being finalized with the architect, and will comply with the California Building Code and Americans with Disabilities Act. The Request for Bid will be presented as early as Thursday, November 3, 2016.

**2. Community Center Painting Project**

The Request for Bid was advertised on Thursday, October 20, 2016 and the mandatory pre-bid meeting for all contractors will be held on Thursday, November 23, 2016 at the Public Works department. A scheduled bid opening will be held on Thursday, November 17, 2016 at the City Clerk's office and Public Works anticipates taking this item to council --- Commissioner DeVost interrupts the oral report to allow a public question to be asked before the departure of Director Perry Brents, the question was address outside of the Council Chambers, off the official record. Mr. Peralta completed his report stating that Public Works hopes to award the contract by January 2017, this concluded the Public Works report.

No report was given on this item.

**2. Park Design – Subcommittee Report**

**1. Community Questionnaire Development**

In the absence of Director Perry Brents, Sheree Lewis reported as follows;

For this item, we would like feedback from the Commissioners who attended the last park design subcommittee meeting.

Before continuing, Mr. Peralta concluded his report requesting that Mrs. Lewis scan and email photos of the truncated discs associated with the Winnie Hanson Performing Arts Stage.

The Community Questionnaire report was delivered as follows;

Mrs. Lewis addressed the Commission again requesting that they share insight regarding the different information given by Community Works Design.

Commissioner Morrison stated that she would have liked to see more involvement from the Cactus/Randall development committee but there were plenty of participants for the Frisbie Park expansion. The primary focus was to develop ideas for the community questionnaires that will be mailed.

Commissioner DeVost discussed the sample community questionnaire that was distributed and stated that there will be 4,000 surveys mailed in both the Cactus/Randall and Frisbie Park neighborhoods, along with an option to complete the survey online. Upcoming meetings will separate the interests of the two park design subcommittees, which will be more progressive for both groups. Before the community questionnaires are finalized, drafts will be reviewed by the Commission and City Council prior to being mailed to the community.

Commissioner Britt said this was a great start for the first meeting and there are many more to come.

### **C. Other Reports**

#### **1. Parks and Facilities Tour – Sheree Lewis**

Sheree Lewis presented an oral report to the Commission detailing the Parks and Facilities Tour as follows;

Mrs. Lewis began with handouts for the Commissioners to review stating that these items are the preliminary map and itinerary for the upcoming tour. Beginning with the map, she explained that the map indicates Parks and Facilities that will be visited along with the itinerary indicating times of each visit. Mrs. Lewis continued to list all facilities and departure times, along with travel arrangements and plans for breakfast and lunch. In addition, Mrs. Lewis distributed an Agenda correlating with the Special Meeting announcement for the public which is related to Action Item 2. In closing, Mrs. Lewis asked if there were any questions;

Commissioner Britt asked if there will be a checklist to rate the conditions of public restrooms and facility grounds? Mrs. Lewis replied there will be a three ring binder with information for each location and a sheet can be added to rate each location. Also, Commissioner DeVost asked if this will include the size of the parks, Mrs. Lewis replied yes along with a list of additional specific details.

Commissioner Morrison asked how the residents will be aware of the tour and how to meet at the parks if desired? Mrs. Lewis responded saying that the Special Meeting Agenda will be posted online and throughout the City in respective areas. The Special Meeting Agenda will also include the map and itinerary and, the agenda will also be laminated and posted at each park and facility as well.

Commissioner Silva mentioned that there is a carnival at Rialto City Park, Mr. Salcedo confirmed that this is not a special event hosted by the City, and there were no permits that he can confirm for that day. Mr. Salcedo also offered to check with staff and send an email updating the status of this event.

## **VI. ACTION ITEMS**

### **1. January 3, 2017 Meeting – Cancellation for Holiday Observance**

Commissioner Britt addressed the Commission asking if the board would prefer going dark in December or January;

Commissioner Trujillo voiced that he prefers to go dark in January because of the New Year holiday. Commissioner Morrison agreed.

Commissioner DeVost motioned to go dark on January 3, 2017, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Trujillo and all were in favor.

## **2. Special Meeting – Parks and Facilities Tour November 12, 2016**

Commissioner Trujillo motioned for the approval of the Parks and Facilities Tour on November 12, 2016, the motion was seconded by Commissioner DeVost and all were in favor.

## **VII. COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS**

**STUDENT COMMISSIONER JOSE FERNANDEZ** – Commissioner Fernandez reported as follows:

He was unable to make it to Halloween Hi-Jinks, but he is looking forward to the upcoming Parks and Facilities Tour.

**COMMISSIONER JOHN SILVA** – Commissioner Silva reported as follows;

He was present at the Halloween Hi-Jinks event and stated that there were too many people in the small space provided. Also, he stated that it was unsafe for kids and that should be the main concern.

**COMMISSIONER JAN MORRISON** – Commissioner Morrison reported as follows:

She mentioned that she was unsure of why the set-up has changed this year, but in past events, the activities were placed in a more accessible area. Also, she commended Jessica (Perez, Recreation Programmer), for bringing a new flavor to this event, but wants the staff to consider more space for this growing event. Commissioner Morrison mentioned the smart phone application NextDoor which allows public information to be shared throughout the community. She enjoys seeing the different activities happening on the South end of Rialto, but wishes there were more centralized activities for both the North and South ends of the city. In closing, she thanked Julio Salcedo for providing the minutes from the Rialto Community Players meeting and stated that her last discussion with Jill was meant in good spirit and hopes that the two boards can work harmoniously. After reviewing the Rialto Community Players minutes, Jan noticed that Jill referred to her discussion with the Commission as difficult, Jan apologized if she contributed to that tone during the last meeting. In addition, she stated that she appreciates the staff sitting in on the Rialto Community Players meetings and would like to work towards keeping an open dialogue.

**COMMISSIONER RAFAEL TRUJILLO** – Commissioner Trujillo reported as follows:

He attended the Grace Vargas renaming event at the Senior Center and wanted to bridge the gap between the Community Services staff and the Friends of the Rialto Senior Center. Mr. Salcedo stated the staff is present during each meeting, and the Friends group does sponsor activities and other resources at the Senior Center and a relationship has definitely been established. Mr. Salcedo offered to include a report of the Friends group and their activities monthly, Commissioner Trujillo expressed that he would appreciate that effort. In closing, he described his experience at the Halloween Hi-Jinks event and stated it was amazing. Last, he addressed an issue with a resident who mentioned the uncleanliness of the woodchips and he wants to know what the plan is to phase the woodchips out completely. Mr. Salcedo stated he will inquire the different options with Public Works department, Mr. Peralta stated that he will provide a report in the upcoming meeting on alternative options for the woodchips in the park. In closing, Commissioner Trujillo stated that he hopes to see everyone at the Hall of Fame event.

Commissioner Morrison stated that she was personally invited to the City of Colton's Hall of Fame, and would like to formally invite Colton's Chair of Recreation and Parks also.

**COMMISSIONER CLIFFORD DEVOST** – Commissioner DeVost reported as follows:

He was present at the subcommittee meetings for park design, everything is off to a good start. Also, he was surprised to see another renaming ceremony that did not come to the Recreation and Parks Commission although there is a policy, it has been overlooked again. Commissioner DeVost was also present at Halloween Hi-Jinks and he also agrees that the event was very overcrowded. In regards to the Rialto Community Players, he believes it is best to uphold the expectations in the MOU. In closing, he asked about details for the upcoming CPRS Mini Conference, Mrs. Lewis replied stating that she will send follow up details to all Commissioners interested in attending once final conference information is received. He commended staff on a job well done at the Hi-Jinks event and looks forward to the Hall of Fame this weekend.

**COMMISSIONER JOE BRITT** – Commissioner Britt reported as follows:

Prior to delivering his report, Commissioner Britt asked two audience members to approach the podium, the couple introduced themselves as;

Eddie Fitz, youth basketball volunteer coach for 3 years for the Johnson Center Gymnasium in Rialto. His efforts are all about the kids, and he wants to offer a solid foundation while teaching the youth about good sportsmanship can carry over into real life.

Karisha Fitz, team mom for youth basketball. She assists with all youth groups coached by her Husband, Eddie Fitz. The Fitz family also assist with afterschool tutoring, mentoring PTA, Church volunteering and the Adopt a School program. Also, she felt the Hi-Jinks event was overcrowded and she found that children were upset that lines were too long to enjoy activities. In closing, she stated that their hearts belong to Parks and Recreation, which is the children.

Commissioner Britt presented his report beginning with his concerns about skateboarders grinding on the steps in front of the Winnie Hansen Performing Arts Stage at Rialto City Park. Also, he

expressed his concerns with an open electric box which exposes wires. He distributed photos addressing his concerns, and asked if it was possible to install truncated domes at a ramp leading up to the steps. Moises responded stating this is a possible solution but is normally used for ADA purposes only and may send the wrong message. Moises recommended that the Public Works department evaluate possible solutions and return with an update on alternatives.

Commissioner Morrison asked if there were signs posted indicating no skateboarding, Moises stated he will also verify if signage is posted as well. Commissioner Trujillo asked if staff could walk the perimeter to ensure that park rules are abided by, Mr. Salcedo stated that there is security walking perimeters at the facilities, but kids will skate wherever they can. Also, Mr. Salcedo shared information about a recent study on gated skate parks which makes enforcement of rules and programming easier and prevents youth from skating during normal school hours. Commissioner Morrison addressed the student Commissioner and suggested that he get feedback from the youth on what could be done to offer more skate areas in the city.

Commissioner Britt continued his report stating that he also attended the Grace Vargas Senior Center renaming and he is happy for Grace but, he would have been more satisfied if the proper channels were addressed as stated in the facility naming policy. Also, he agreed that he would prefer to keep more communication lines open with the Rialto Community Players regarding the MOU. He also experienced the overcrowded feeling of the Halloween Hi-Jinks event and the space could have been better utilized.

**JULIO SALCEDO** – Julio reported as follows:

He thanked the Commission for feedback on the Hi-Jinks event and stated that there was a staff meeting today and their concerns about space were also addressed. Also, he invited the Commissioners to the Hall of Fame event on Saturday and later the same day, there will be a Dive-In Movie feature where guests can swim and watch a movie. In closing, he thanked staff and Eisenhower students for volunteering at the Hi-Jinks event.

**SHEREE LEWIS** – Sheree reported as follows:

She will be sure to follow-up on all requests made and offered assistance to all Commissioners.

**KIARA BROWN** – Kiara reported as follows:

So far so good, she's learning a lot.

**COMMISSIONER SCOTT SPARKS** – Absent

**COMMISSIONER JOSUE CASTILLO** – Absent

**II. TOUR SITES**

**1. Community Center**

Prior to departure, Commissioners were given a binder including the tour itinerary, map of locations, and amenity details of each location. Also included was a score card for rating and providing feedback for each location.

Recreation Programmer Che Wilson gave an overview of the Community Center. This site also includes the Margaret Todd Park and Skate Park which Mr. Wilson gave a guided tour for the Commissioners.

Commissioners were escorted by two's Caravan style with two vehicle escorts for the remainder of the tour.

## **2. Bud Bender Park**

Commissioners visited Bud Bender Park next, Mr. Brents pointed out the newly installed outdoor exercise equipment as Commissioners browsed the Park.

Commissioner DeVost asked for the Park size, Mr. Brents offered acreage details and defined Community Parks sizes vs. Neighborhood Park sizes.

## **3. Andreson Park**

Upon visiting Andreson Park, Commissioners were pleased to see Park Rules clearly displayed along with an existing walking path for the public to enjoy.

## **4. Fergusson Park**

After arriving to Fergusson Park, Commissioner Rafael Trujillo joined the group for the remainder of the tour. While browsing the park grounds, Mr. Brents made mention of graffiti in various areas of the park instructing Mrs. Lewis to make note to report to the Public Works Department. Also, Commissioner's noticed that bleacher wind guards were in great shape and mentioned that other parks could use reupholstering. Before departure, Commissioners discussed options for additional public use amenities in the open grass areas of this park.

## **5. Roger Birdsall Park**

During the perusal of Birdsall Park, Commissioner Trujillo pointed out the old, rotted woodchips which were filled with small trash particles and asked what alternatives can be applied to improve this area near the children's play apparatus, Mr. Brents instructed Mrs. Lewis to make note of this. Also, Mr. Brents noticed tire marks on the grass and uneven walking paths which he referred to as needs for ADA upgrades.

## **6. Jerry Eaves Park**

An annual soccer tournament was being hosted at the time of arrival to Jerry Eaves Park, Commissioners were a bit puzzled by the blocking off of parking spaces by volunteers but were later reassured by soccer league staff that this action was taken only due to the heavy traffic volume for this tournament.

## **7. Flores Park**

At Flores Park, Commissioners noticed that there was a sandbox and were curious if this was still an acceptable standard for the park. Also, City signs were posted listing prohibited activities but did not list No Skateboarding as young teens were there skateboarding. Before departure, it was

discovered that a foreign object was shoved in the drinking fountain forcing water to spew upward making the drinking fountain unusable; Mr. Brents instructed Mrs. Lewis to make note of this.

#### **8. Warren Frisbie Park**

Upon approach of Frisbie Park, Mr. Brents pointed out the undeveloped land areas that were to be considered for the Subcommittee Park Design expansion and lead commissioners on a trail explaining the City and County line distinctions. Commissioners were also lead to another undeveloped land area that will be considered in the new expansion effort were discussions about a need for parking space took place. Last, a no smoking sign was noticed, but it did not have the exclusion of e-cigarettes which Mr. Brents explained will be replaced when all parks receive new no smoking postings.

#### **9. Rialto City Park, Fitness and Aquatics Center and Sandra Courtney Playhouse Theater**

The first stop on property was the Sandra Courtney Playhouse where the group was greeted by Ms. Sandra Courtney herself where she gave history of the Rialto Community Players, along with an exclusive indoor tour. Commissioners were given access to back stage, props, dressing rooms and more.

Next, Commissioners were led into the Tom Sawyer pool area where they were given an opportunity to browse the locker rooms, new deck and see a private swim lesson in action. Upon departure from the pool area, Commissioners were lead into the Fitness Center; with most being familiar with the facility, self-exploration was permitted.

Last, the group was led outdoors to Rialto City Park to peruse the tennis courts where it was notices that wind guards were shredded and should be replaced. There were comments made about the placement of restroom facilities, and there was also a leaking water fountain; Mr. Brents instructed Mrs. Lewis to make note of this.

#### **10. Grace Vargas Senior Center**

As the group was greeted by Terre Ermitano to begin the guided facility tour, Mrs. Grace Vargas herself appeared unexpectedly with her Grandchildren and decided to join the tour also. Terre gave a very detailed and historical explanation of each room, corporate sponsors involved, and daily activities that are facilitated on the grounds.

As the tour came to a close, staff arranged a light lunch for the tour participants where the meal was shared in one of the conference rooms on site.

The tour ended and the special meeting was adjourned at 2:00 PM.
