

A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Dear Friends,

Access to transportation is among a community's most prized assets, creating competitive advantages and bold new opportunities while improving our quality of life and ability to connect to the world around us.

In Rialto, proximity to major freeways, rail lines and major logistics operations are redefining our economy – connecting employers with employees, spurring new economic development activity and fortifying our reputation as a city on the move.

In that vein, I am happy to report that our city is under consideration for a \$72 million grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation to improve the I-10 interchange and Riverside Avenue – a vital transportation link for Rialto and the region as a whole.

I would like to thank Caltrans and Assembly member Cheryl Brown for their support of this important project, which, if approved, would reduce commute times, facilitate goods movement and generate additional jobs throughout the Inland Empire.

It truly is an investment in our future. According to the Southern California Association of Governments' recently approved 2016-2040 Regional Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy, every \$1 spent on transportation improvements yield a return of about \$2 in the form of reduced congestion, improved air quality, economic development opportunities and increased worker productivity.

The I-10/Riverside Avenue project also speaks to the importance of freight and goods movement to our local and regional economy. Directly or indirectly, this industry sector accounts for one-third of all jobs and economic activity in Southern California, with the Inland Empire quickly becoming a hub.

Maximizing this opportunity moving forward will require robust investment in our highways and rail systems to ensure that commuter traffic flow isn't compromised and that our air quality doesn't suffer. Compounding this is the reality that our population is continuing to grow. SCAG projects that San Bernardino County alone will add 660,000 people between now and 2040.

With that in mind, our proposal seeks to address projected growth in traffic along the I-10 and the Aqua Mansa Corridor leading into Riverside Avenue. The plan includes construction of a single span bridge, expansion of the on and off ramps at the I-10 freeway and expansion of the Union Pacific Railroad bridge.

We're proud to have played a leadership role in getting the I-10/Riverside Avenue proposal to this point. Transportation is key to Rialto's future, and appreciate the federal government's consideration of this critical project.

New Additions to the Fire Department Fleet

Your Rialto Fire Department will be welcoming two new fire engines to its fleet of emergency response vehicles. Fire engines, staffed with a Fire Captain (the officer in charge of the engine and crew), a Fire Engineer (the driver and operator), and a Firefighter / Paramedic, respond to all types of emergency and non-emergency incidents. Fire engines carry 600 gallons of water and a fire pump capable of pumping 1500 gallons of water per minute when attached to a fire hydrant. Fire engines are an "all-risk" tool

box carrying a large array of firefighting, rescue, hazardous materials and advanced life support medical equipment.

The useful life of a fire engine is generally based on the cost to maintain it. Age and mileage combine for an effective estimate of life span of a fire engine. After approximately 125,000 miles (which usually takes 8 to 10 years) most fire engines will cost more to maintain than to replace with a new fire engine. All but one of Rialto's fire engine fleet exceeds this age and mileage threshold. Once these new engines are placed in service, two existing engines can be placed in a reserve status for use when front-line engines need regular maintenance or repair. These reserves can also be staffed as additional units during a major emergency.

All of the fire department's current fire engines are manufactured by Pierce Manufacturing. The two new engines were also manufactured by Pierce; this brings with it a cost savings in maintenance and operational efficiency by reducing the need for both operations and repair training to a single platform. Pierce built the fire engines in their factory in Appleton, Wisconsin. The two new fire engines are also a new specification for Rialto which brings more maneuverability and more compartment space. This specification has been used by other fire agencies for an extended period with documented reduction in maintenance costs over the current Rialto fire fleet.

In an effort to reduce costs fire department staff found that utilizing the buying power of a large cooperative purchasing group would provide the greatest savings to the City. The City of Rialto entered into an Interlocal Contract with Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC-Buy) to participate in their cooperative purchasing program. HGACBuy is a "Government-to-Government" procurement service available nationwide. The benefits of utilizing this cooperative purchasing program is that it assists local governments in reducing costs by capitalizing on bulk purchasing power and pre-established competitive bids. The new fire engines cost \$624,000 each. Through design efficiencies and the use of the HGACBuy program the City realized a savings of \$182,000 in the purchase of the new fire engines over previous purchase processes.

Once the new engines arrive in Rialto they will undergo acceptance testing and then be outfitted with the essential equipment needed for your Rialto firefighters to meet their mission. The new engines will be assigned to Fire Station 201 (131 S. Willow Ave.) and Fire Station 202 (1700 N. Riverside Ave.) and will be out serving the community in the near future.

THE BRIDGE TO PROGRESS

Grant Funding



The Explorer Post began in 1975 and has been the starting point for many law enforcement officers. The program is one of career exploration and education for youth ages 14 to 21, interested in learning and excelling in a professional career of law enforcement. Currently, our post has 22 members, all of whom play an important role in our organization; we are hoping to expand our post to 40 members.



This position is very prestigious with the explorer assuming and being assigned a very large role of responsibility. The explorer is instructed and educated about the methods of police work. During the process of growing through the explorer program, fundamentals of discipline, work values and the practices of law enforcement are taught and strictly adhered to.

Explorers participate in many community and police functions which include: traffic control during parades and city events, police patrol ride-a-longs with police officers; special assignments to include gang sweeps, search warrants, DUI checkpoints, and Undercover operations and police patrolled security in addition to many city wide special events donating more than 6,500 hours of service to the department and community.

Each year we go to the California State Officer Memorial in Sacramento, compete in a Nationwide Explorer competition in Las Vegas, as well as participate in our City of Rialto's Open House, International Festival, National Night Out, Halloween Hi-jinks, and any other events that the City may need us for.

The Explorer Post holds weekly meetings on Wednesdays between 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm and address training topics related to law enforcement as well as incorporating training in areas of civic involvement and special projects which benefit the entire community.

The Rialto Police Department wants to help protect residents' property from opportunistic thieves with a new vacation program designed to catch criminals in the act.

Beginning in May 2014, Rialto residents can contact the Rialto Police Department before leaving for any extended period of time and arrange for an police officer to place a small tracking device that can be hidden on items of value that are particularly attractive to burglars, such as home electronics, safes, or other items.

The motion sensitive device is activated once the resident leaves on vacation. Any movement of the device will set off a signal that sends a text to both the resident and the Police Department. Officers tracking software with the device to quickly locate the stolen property and the thief.

California Car Seat Law Changes

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2017



NEW ADDITION

Starting January 1, 2017, children under 2-years old must be rear-facing unless they weigh 40 pounds or more, or are 40 inches tall or more.

Children must be properly buckled in a car seat which is **rear-facing until age 2**

CURRENT LAW

Children under age 8 must be buckled into a car seat or booster in the back seat.

Children age 8 or older, or who are 4'9" or taller, may use the vehicle seat belt if it fits properly with the lap belt low on the hips, touching the upper thighs, and the shoulder belt crossing the center of the chest. If children are not tall enough for proper belt fit, they must ride in a booster or car seat.

Everyone in the car must be properly buckled up.

Most children will outgrow an infant seat before age 1

- The next step is a convertible car seat.
- Rear-facing is 5 times safer than forward-facing.
- The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that children ride rear-facing to the highest weight or height allowed by the car seat manufacturer.

Kaitlyn's Law

It's against California law to leave a child under the age of seven alone in the car without the supervision of a person at least 12 years old if:

1. The keys are in the ignition or the car is running, or
2. There is a significant risk to the child.

FINES & PENALTIES

For each child under 16 who is not properly secured, parents (if in the car) or drivers can be fined more than \$500 and get a point on their driving records.

Keep your children safe. It's the law!





GARAGE SALE

REGULATIONS



No Permit Required
as of March 26, 2013

5.69.060 - Frequency, Duration & Permissible Dates.

- A. Subject to the additional limitations imposed by subsections B and C of this section, no garage sale shall be conducted by any person or at any location more frequently than four (4) times in any calendar year. For the purposes of this section, 'calendar year' means the twelve (12) month period from January through December, inclusive.
- B. Garage sales may be conducted up to a maximum period of three (3) consecutive days.
- C. Garage sales shall only be conducted on the first weekend of the months of March, June, September and December. For the purposes of this subsection, the term 'weekend' means Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

5.69.080 - Restrictions & Conditions.

Garage sales shall comply with all of the following regulations:

- A. Garage sales shall be conducted only during daylight hours.
- B. No property offered for sale at a garage sale shall be stored, displayed, or offered for sale within public rights-of-way or on public property at any time.
- C. Property offered for sale at a garage sale may be displayed in the front or side yards of the premises where the sale is conducted.
- D. All property to be sold at a garage sale shall be limited to used personal property owned, utilized and maintained by the seller of property or members of his/her family on or in connection with the premises where the sale will be conducted or group of residences within the same neighborhood. No new or used property acquired or consigned solely for the purposes of resale shall be displayed or offered for sale or trade.

- E. All merchandise offered for sale at a garage sale shall be made available for inspection by the city's code enforcement division. If requested by the code enforcement division, the seller of property conducting the garage sale shall produce evidence of title or ownership to the merchandise offered for sale.

5.69.100 - Advertising.

- A. No more than two (2) signs, not more than four square feet, shall be permitted to be displayed on the property of the residence where the garage sale is being conducted.
- B. The posting of garage sale directional signs on public property, including, but not limited to, parkways, greenbelts, bus benches, sidewalks, curbs, vehicle safety poles, signs, and stanchions, or upon any parked vehicle on a public street, alley, or parking lot, or upon utility poles is unlawful. Directional signs not larger than eight hundred sixty-four square inches may be placed on private property provided the person conducting the garage sale has obtained the prior consent therefore from the owner or occupant of the premises where the directional sign is placed. There shall be no more than four such directional signs erected for any garage sale permitted pursuant to this chapter.

5.69.110 - Violation – Penalty.

- A. General. Unless expressly provided otherwise by this chapter, violation of any part of this chapter shall be punishable as an infraction.
- B. Multiple Violations. - A person who violates the same section of this chapter more than three times within one year shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

STAGE 2 WATER ALERT IS NOW IN EFFECT

On July 26, 2016, the City of Rialto relaxed water conservation requirements to reflect the latest drought conditions. The newly adopted Stage 2 Water Alert is necessary to help the City of Rialto maintain a sufficient water supply.

Rialto Water Services is requiring customers to:



Reduce water use by 20 percent.

Limit outdoor watering to **four days per week between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.**; 10 minutes per station maximum. (Unless using drip irrigation or a weather-based irrigation controller.)



Repair leaks within 72 hours of notification by the City.



Refrain from watering during or within 48 hours of measurable rainfall, and on windy days.



Prevent water waste from runoff, overspray, breaks and leaks.



Avoid hosing off sidewalks, driveways and patios.



Use a hose with an automatic shutoff nozzle when washing vehicles.



Use a recirculating pump in fountains and water features.



Hotels and motels must provide guests with the option of not laundering sheets and towels daily.



Restaurants may serve water only on request.





The Links, Incorporated founded in 1946, is one of the oldest and largest volunteer service organizations of women who are committed to enriching, sustaining and ensuring the culture and economic survival of African Americans and other persons of African ancestry.

Members of The San Bernardino Valley (CA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated (est. 1979), have a great program designed to help mothers in Africa and Haiti while at the same time giving new life to an unwanted t-shirt. The San Bernardino Valley (CA) Chapter collects clean, used t-shirts and sews them into reusable cloth diapers. The reusable cloth (t-shirt) diapers are then donated to mothers in need.

On average, one child will use, 5000 disposable diapers and it takes, approximately, 700 years for one disposable diaper to disintegrate. For underdeveloped countries, disposable diapers are costly and wasteful.

This October, the City of Rialto Waste Management Division will be collecting used t-shirts and donating them to The San Bernardino Valley (CA) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated.
